NRP with Self inflating bags

Self inflating bags arrived at FFTH – Carrie Hartman

Advantages:

Built in manometer gauge that can be seen from the side or head of baby

Pop off valve to prevent excessive pressure

When the red cap is removed there is a luer lock to administer medications

Refer to hand out

Stay posted for when we will go live for using them.

For resuscitation use the self inflating bag with room air if baby does not respond, then use the neopuff with 100 % O₂.

Family Feud

OR setup review

OR prep for code green when OR crew not present yet.

Start at the head of bed with the anesthesia cart

Turn on switch on front right side.

Turn on maternal airway suction at back of anesthesia cart on wall

The Neptune is for suctioning of the maternal abdomen not for airway suctioning.

We should not need baby suction because we do not suction on the abdomen with wall suction any more.

Turn on the Bovie machine On the back of the machine, attach the pads to the maternal leg, arm or large muscle areas of her back. Plug in the cord and set the machine to 30/30. Say to the doctor the Bovie is set at 30/30 in case he wants to have the levels adjusted.

Turn the csection pack ¼ turn on the table so that the drapes are evenly covering the table when open.

Helping Women Meet Breastfeeding Goals- Courtney Phillips

Refer to hand out:

1. The nursing pattern & milk supply. Depo given prior to 6 week visit is not helpful for breastfeeding Moms. Not recommended.

2. Skin to skin 1st hour after birth is encouraged for both parents.
3. Signs of a good latch: nose to nipple, nice open mouth, head tilted back, baby's bottom lip and tongue reach for breast before latch. Nose and chin are close to breast, angle of mouth open 140 degrees, rounded cheek line, rocker jaw motion, comfortable for mother.
4. Signs of a satisfying feeding. Baby releases nipple, baby has soft, relaxed body tone, relaxed hands, mothers nipple looks similar to prefeeding shape.
5. Drugs that decrease milk supply: Sudafed, betamethasone, birth control meds before 6 weeks, and retained placenta fragments.

Every breastfeeding Mom should be taught how to hand express before discharge.

The Marmet technique for hand expression. "position, push roll: Place thumb on top of areola and pointer finger under at 12 and 6 o'clock in C position. Push back towards chest wall and roll fingers with breast tissue towards nipple. Repeat until milk is expressed then turn hand to another position on the clock to empty other ducts.
